CHARITY OF THE YEAR

Help children to survive and thrive in 2019 – choose Save the Children as your charity of the year:


- Hold regular events

These tips and tricks will help you tee off your fundraising for children.

ORGANISE A TOURNAMENT

Players can collect donation pledges or pay to take part. You could play:



SCRAMBLE

Usually played in teams of four. Each player tees off. The best shot is selected, and all players play their second shot from there (remember - you can drop your ball within one club length of the chosen ball, but no closer to the hole). Repeat until the ball is holed.

BEST BALL

Usually played in teams of four. Each player plays their own ball throughout the round. But on each hole, only the lowest score in the group is counted. It doesn't have to be just one - you can score as many balls as you like to keep the whole team invested!



FOURSOME

Usually played in pairs. Players take alternate shots of the same ball until it is holed. Remember to switch who tees off on each hole.

GOLF MARATHON

4 rounds in one day. 72 holes and 20 miles of walking – you're guaranteed to get sponsors for this challenge!

FUNDRAISING IDEAS

Partner with businesses – Ask local businesses for sponsorship and feature their brand on your tournament shirts, hole flags, and tournament programme in return.

SELL MULLIGANS


Sell tokens symbolising Mulligans (free shots) that players can pull out when they need it most.

IN-TOURNAMENT PRIZES

Award prizes for nearest to the hole, longest drive, lowest team score, best adjusted (handicap) score, and hole in ones (you never know).

THE GREAT GOLF BALL DROP

Sell tickets to enter a one-off 'closest to the mark' event.



RAFFLES AND AUCTIONS

Hold an auction in the clubhouse after your tournament. Prizes could include:

- Lessons
- Free rounds
- Clubs and equipment
- A round with a celebrity (if you have contacts)
- Meal or free drinks



BAKE SALES

Sell your finest cakes in the clubhouse or office.

OFFICE CRAZY GOLF

Take over the office one lunchtime and get putting.


USE YOUR SKILL
